This program will connect individuals with needed resources to prepare for success in IT jobs. Sunny Floum and Rivel Greenberg, two former longstanding Walker Art Center docents, are now affiliated with the American Swedish Institute and will show us two newly-mounted exhibitions: "The Morning Dip", a portrait photography series by Swedish - American artist Peggy Anderson to be followed by selected works of Swedish-American painter and printmaker, Birger Sandzen. The "Dip" lets us experience locals from a Swedish coastal village taking a morning plunge into freezing near-by lakes. We can see something like this here when hearty Minnesotans jump into freezing waters in January and February! Sandzen's landscapes have a bold use of stroke and color and have been compared to Vincent van Gogh and Paul Cezanne.

Adding to the visit, the mansion setting of the building will also be a vital part of the tour. Lunch at Fika (not included in tour fee) is available for those interested.
