"Where were you 60 years ago today? The JFK Assassination and the Minnesota Connections in Law, Literature and Lore," presented by Marshall Tanick, constitutional lawyer, and historian.

On November 22nd, 1963, at approximately 12:30 p.m., President John F. Kennedy was fatally shot in Dallas, Texas while riding in a motorcade with his wife, Jacqueline Kennedy, Texas Governor, John Connally and his wife Nelly Connally. The motorcade rushed to Parkland Hospital where at 1:00 p.m., the President was pronounced dead. Attorney Marshall Tanick will re-live and re-think this day for all of us!
