I was born in Minneapolis, and my family and I lived in various cities over the years, including Chicago; Gary, Indiana; Salt Lake City, Utah; and St. Louis Park.

I started taking dancing and voice lessons when living in Salt Lake City and Chicago. We then moved to St. Louis Park, and after graduating from St. Louis Park High School, I went to the U of M for two years. I moved to California and continued pursuing dancing and singing. I eventually moved to New York City and studied dancing and music there too. I danced in "Wonder World," in 1964 at the New York World's Fair. I had the distinction of dancing with Chita Rivera and Gretchen Wilder! And, I was involved in a Little Theater Company, where John Parkinson was the director. It was there I met and developed a life-long friendship with none other than Morgan Freeman, who came and auditioned for a show in which I was dancing.

A few other roles I performed, among many others, were: "West Side Story" as Graziella and Francisca; "Once Upon a Mattress" as Lady in Waiting; "Can Can" as Marie; "Oklahoma" as Ado Annie; "Finian's Rainbow" as Second Sharecropper"; and "Annie Get Your Gun" as Winnie Tate. I performed in concert with the U of M Folk Dancers; Israel-America Club; Yugoslavian Folk Dancers; German Folk Dancers; and Russian Folk Dancers.

Then I moved back to San Francisco and worked at the University of California San Francisco, based at General Hospital, in the Department of Medicine as an administrative assistant. After that, I moved to New York again, where I finally retired.

I eventually relocated to Minneapolis to live with my mother after my father passed away. I remained in the home until March 2022, when I moved to Jones-Harrison Assisted Living, I keep very busy and am extremely happy. And, as you probably know, I served as a past-president of BOND for two-years. I am most grateful for all the close friendships I have made because of my involvement with the organization.
